From biting to hatching, let's explore the life cycle of these tiny vampires. A female bed bug can lay hundreds of eggs in her lifetime, which are as tiny as a speck of dust. In about ten days, these eggs hatch into baby bed bugs called nymphs. These nymphs must have a meal of blood before they can grow and shed their skin five times to become adults.



Now, you might be wondering how these tiny bugs defend themselves. Well, unlike some insects, bed bugs don't have stingers or strong jaws to bite. Their main defense is being sneaky, hiding during the day, and coming out at night when you're asleep. So, always remember, these tiny, shy bugs could be anywhere since they are really good at hide and seek!
